About MEDIUM

The main goal of the project MEDIUM is to study the dynamics of Chinese urbanisation, focusing on medium-sized cities - Hangzhou, Zhuhai, Datong - through various aspects: urban governance and strategic planning, innovative clusters, land and housing policy, urban mobility, ICT and smart policy, migrant workers' inclusion, etc.

The project key actions include:

- Facilitating European researchers' mobility and train them as experts of Urban China;
- Establishing a dialogue between academic, political and economic communities;
- Training Chinese scholars to participatory approaches in urban planning;
- · Organising collaborative workshops involving local stakeholders.

The consortium is composed of nine entities: French National Centre for Scientific Research (CNRS) project leader — Università Ca' Foscari Venezia — Aix en Provence Political Institute (IEP Aix) — Spatial Foresight GMBH — Lausanne University — Neuchâtel University — Sun Yat-sen University — Hangzhou Normal University Shanxi Datong University.

This is the second international event organised in the context of the MEDIUM project. While research conducted in the context of the project focus primarily on medium-sized cities, the conference will consider urban China in its diversity, with a great variety of case studies including Beijing, Guangzhou, Shanghai, Tianjin, the region of the Taihu lake etc.

It will address the issue of sustainability from a broad perspective, tackling ageing housing, social inclusion, urban governance, environmental sustainability, participatory processes in urban planning, with a multi-disciplinary approach ranging from geography, political science, economy, sociology, computer science, to environmental science etc.

The conference is open to academics, policy makers, urban professionals etc.
